

Transport of Mi-17s from Afghanistan

In December 2011, in support of DOD counter-narcotics operations, Prüst Holding B.V. (Prüst) successfully orchestrated the breakdown, upload, and transport of six Mi-17 helicopters from Kabul, Afghanistan to Eindhoven International Airport (EIN) in the Netherlands. Managing all aspects of this logistics operation, Prüst support included:

1. Project Management of an international team in Afghanistan and provision of “in-country” billeting, transportation, and life support
2. Chartering IL-76 for Mi-17 pickup and transport
3. Oversight of the disassembly of the Mi-17 helicopters
4. Managing parts removal and packaging
5. Obtaining all customs permissions to move these aircraft from Afghanistan and into the European Union
6. Downloading and storing of aircraft at Prüst’s warehouse for onward distribution to overhaul facilities in Eastern Europe and the Russian Federation

Supply of Petroleum, Oil, and Lubricants (POLs) to Aviation Fleet Maintenance in Kabul

In February 2012, Prüst successfully supplied POLs to Aviation Fleet Maintenance and the 438th Expeditionary Air Wing. This project required procurement and delivery of POLs to five Forward Operating Base locations in Afghanistan to support aircraft flown during counter-narcotics and counterterrorism missions. The project included:

1. Procuring of 53,000lbs of POL material
2. Packaging, labeling, and consolidating POLs and chartering 747 to Azerbaijan
3. Chartering IL-76 for POL shipment to ISAF facility at Kabul International Airport
4. Downloading and transferring material from the IL-76 to ground transportation company
5. Shipment was broken down and prepped for the five FOB destinations
6. At FOBs, Prüst performed delivery assurance, quality inspections, final inventory and turnover to the customer
